MBA (TOURISM & TRAVEL MANAGEMENT)

The two-year full-time Master of Business Administration (Tourism & Travel Management) degree (as per the MoU signed under the collaborative scheme of Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi– Ministry of Education, Govt. of India) is offered for learners to enable them to acquire the suitable skill set with ample flexibility to adapt to employing the organization's needs. The academic year of the degree is comprised of one year with two semesters each.

The curriculum of the course is so modeled that the student has nurtured for the requirements of the industry as well as academia. Along with the core subjects like economics, management, etc. Students are also given the option of doing specialization like tour guiding, event management, and adventure tourism and also the option of studying supply chain and logistics. The course also comprises a portion of summer internships where they get the opportunity to an interface with the latest trends in the industry.

The fourth semester of the course comprises of On Job Training which is facilitated through campus interviews every year.

In order to understand the nitty-gritty involved in the industry students are taken for a study toour mostly to well-known tourist destinations across the country.

GRADE POINT REQUIREMENTS/MINIMUM STANDARD

A participant joining the programme semester-wise will be required to maintain a SGPA of 4.00 at the end of each semester.

A participant, in order to be eligible for the award of MBA degree, must have: (a) passed all the semesters / prescribed courses as laid down; (b) he/she has obtained a CGPA of 4.00 at the end of the program.

RESERVATION:

Reservation (for Indian Nationals) will be applicable per central government guidelines, i.e. 7.5% for S.T., 15% for SC, 27% for OBC (under the non-creamy layer) and 10% for EWS candidates. In all the available seats, a 3% horizontal reservation shall also be applicable for physically disabled candidates for admission to MBA (Tourism & Travel Management) 2025-27. Physically disabled candidates are strongly encouraged to apply.

Note: The candidate from SC / ST / OBC / PWD must produce the valid category certificate issued by the competent authority. The OBC candidate must produce a non-creamy layer certificate per central Govt. regulations and issued by the competent authority within the last three years (please refer to Annexure A).

AGE LIMIT:

There is no age bar for pursuing an MBA (TTM) for any category.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

1) Candidates seeking admission to the MBA (TTM) programme shall be required to possess a **Bachelor's degree** from a recognized Indian or foreign university (as per the AIU foreign equivalence list), having secured a minimum of 50% aggregate in case of General and OBC categories and 45% in case of candidates belonging to SC/ST categories are eligible to apply.

Note: If the seats reserved for SC/ST remain vacant, then the same will be filled by the SC/ST candidates who appear for the entrance exam, irrespective of their ranking in the exam.

Candidates appearing in the final year examination of graduation are also eligible to apply, *subject until they must submit their result of graduation with the requisite percentage of marks by September 30, 2025, failing which their admission will be cancelled and the course fee deposited in the Institute will also be forfeited.* (In this regard, the *student must submit an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.100/-*).

- viii. Appear in the written "IITTM Admission Test (IIAT)" to be conducted by IITTM. The admission Test (AT) will be held on June 8, 2025 (Sunday) (tentative) from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm through online mode. The online test details will be notified later via the IITTM website, email, and telecommunication.

It will be an online objective type test with four options of nearest answers carrying 100 questions /100 marks [General Awareness (50 Marks), Verbal ability (25 Marks) and Quantitative ability (25 marks)]. One mark for each correct answer and no negative marking for the wrong answer.

Short-listed candidates will be required to appear for **G.D. and P.I. through hybrid mode (online or offline)** at any one of the **IITTM centres**, which they have to mark in the admission form:

SELECTION PROCESS:

A candidate to be considered for admission in MBA (TTM) 2025-27 would have to participate in all three components of the screening process, as mentioned below. If the candidate does notappear in one of the components of the screening process, it will not included in the merit list. The admission in MBA (TTM) 2025-27 would be strictly based on the **overall performance** of **written test + G.D. + P.I.**, as explained below:

Inter-se-merit will be determined based on the above out of a maximum of 100 marks by moderating the written test score into 70% of the total marks obtained by the candidate, as practiced by the Institute.

- **a.** In case two or more candidates have scored equal marks, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be determined based on higher scores and thereafter older in age.
- **b.** If the candidate fails to establish eligibility by **September 30, 2025**, the admission will be canceled, and fees will be forfeited.

REFUND POLICY

The refund policy is applicable per the guidelines of UGC / JNU, New Delhi.

- Process of refund of tuition, development and other fees after cancellation of admission secured through CAP rounds, institute level round(s) and vacancy round(s) of admission.
- The candidate who has been provisionally admitted may cancel admission by submitting an application for cancellation in duplicate and may request a refund of thefee within the prescribed date.
- If the online portal fails to detect the non-eligible applicant, then the responsibility lies with the applicant. So, the applicant needs to ensure their eligibility before applying for Admissions 2025.
- As applicable, the fee shall be refunded in due course. It is clear that such cancellation application will be considered if and only if the admission is confirmed by paying the prescribed tuition fee and other fees in full and by submitting the original documents.
- Refund shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges as shown:

Note:

- The commencement date of the academic season 2025-27 is July 15, 2025, and it will count for all purposes of refunding fee cases.
- All refund cases will be settled in **October 2025**.

FEE STRUCTURE*

IITTM has a modest fee regime. The fee is payable at the beginning of each semester. The inclusions in the fees are described as follows:

Note:

- 1. Students would be required to deposit academic and hostel fees semester-wise in their respective IITTM centre by the schedule of deposit, failing which the student or disciplinary action will pay a late fee will be taken as decided by the authority under the rules of the Institute.
- 2. Programme fee would be non-payable of the programme as well as other fees, and all the relevant results/semester grade cards/ Degree Certificates and other etc () will be withheld by the Institute with the approval of the Competent Authority of the Institute. The same will be released only after the deposit of the fee.
- **3.** The hostel fee must be paid separately to the respective IITTM centre and applies only to students whom the Institute allots hostel.
- 4. Caution: The money deposit in the program's first semester is refundable to the student after completing their MBA (TTM) 2025-27 course after the production of the No Dues Certificate(NDC) and receipt of fees and the caution money.
- 5. Study Tour is mandatory for all students, and the study tour fee is non-refundable.

*Fee estimates are indicative and subject to the competent authority's approval.

IMPORTANT POINTS

- **1.** The Institute shall not be responsible for any postal / courier delays in correspondence related to the admission process.
- 2. Candidates admitted to the programme in the merit list and who cannot get admission to the programme of their first choice shall be placed on a waiting list. Movements through waiting lists are strictly based on merit.
- **3.** Once a candidate has been admitted to one of the programmes of IITTM at any of the centres and his / her name is forwarded to JNU, his / her admission shall not be transferred to anyother programme of the Institute.
- 4. Admission to the hostel is purely on a merit basis and the availability of accommodation in it.
- 5. A candidate/guardian must declare ailment and any medical history at admission.
- **6.** Students, upon admission, shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules and regulations of the Institute, hostel, examination, etc.
- **7.** All matters are to be settled subject to the jurisdiction of the Madhya Pradesh High Court Gwalior Bench.

SCHOLARSHIP

Students of IITTM can avail of **government scholarships** offered by various agencies to students of different categories. The Central Govt. and State Governments are providing the scholarship (refund of tuition fee) to students belonging to OBC, SC, S.T., P.H. and minorities. FACILITIES AT IITTM

IITTM centres have state-of-the-art infrastructure that supports a learning environment. Some of the variant features are as follows:

- All the classrooms have air-conditioner facilities and are well-equipped with state-of-the-art technology like projectors.
- All the campuses have Wi–Fi facilities around the clock.
 - Gwalior campus is having hostel facility, auditorium, ardh vrat (mini-open auditorium), gym facility, conference room, computerlab, one of the best libraries of tourism in the country, canteen, lush green garden, indoor sports complex (under constructed), open auditorium (under constructed), hostel mess, medicalfacilities, outdoor sports facilities like cricket cum football ground with night light facility, badminton court, basketball court and indoor sports facilities like billiard tables, table tennis, chess, carrom board, boxing punching bag, PNB ATM facility, etc.
 - Bhubaneswar campus has a hostel facility, gym facility, conference room, computer lab, library, canteen, hostel mess, medical facilities, sports facilities etc.
 - The Noida campus is surrounded by a pleasing atmosphere, and it has a hostel facility, gym facility, conference room, computer labs, library, canteen, hostel mess, medical facilities, sports facilities etc.
 - Nellore campus is situated in the lap of nature near coastal areas and has a hostel facility, conference room, computer lab, library, canteen, medical facilities, sports facilities etc.
 - NIWS IITTM Goa is located in the Capital City, Panjim of Goa. Besides the MBA, the campus offers Watersports Courses. The Institute has a beautiful view of Caranzalem Beach from its premises, and the Dona Paula Jetty Point is just a walking distance from the campus. The campus has hostel facilities, a library, well-furnished classrooms with audio-visual aids, an auditorium, a boat house, a Watersports training area and an Olympic-sized Swimming Pool. The campus's pristine weather and clear sky provide an opportunity to do Star-gazing and photography.

The campuses offer limited hostel facilities to students at a very affordable price (*though a hostel room is not guaranteed*). Hostel rental varies from Rs. 5,500/-* to Rs. 7,500/-*for a semester, depending upon the type of accommodation. The fee excludes the caution money deposit and electricity charges. The hostel mess costs approximately Rs. 3,500/-* to Rs. 4,000/-* per month (may vary from campus to campus).

WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- 1. Any conduct by any student or students, whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling a fresher or any other student with rudeness.
- 2. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm, or to raise fear or apprehension thereof

in any fresher or any other student.

- 3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, torment or embarrassment to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- 4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- 5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- 6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- 7. Any act of physical abuse, including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- 8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, or public insults would also derive perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- 9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student withor without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- 10. Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the grounds of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.
- 11. All the senior students are advised to guide and treat junior Students affectionately.
- 12. Junior students may contact their Chairpersons or other Institute functionaries like the Nodal Officer, Assistant Professor, Programme Officer, Administrative Officer, Chairman Students' Welfare, Wardens or Security Officer for help and guidance.
